


# How to Use Fentanyl Test Strips:

## Methamphetamine





This is about 2 points worth of meth, or 1/5<sup>th</sup> of a gram.



Separate a very small amount, the size of a match head or a little less.



Next, get a clean cooker or something else similar in size, like a clean paper ketchup cup. Open the package and set your fentanyl test strip aside.





Put the little bit of meth into the cooker and get some clean water. If possible, use bottled water to avoid possible reactions from chemicals or minerals that may be present in tap water.





Carefully add water to the cooker until it is ¾ or more of the way full and gently swirl the cooker until the meth dissolves.

Dip the wavy end of the test strip up to the solid line and count to 15. You will see the strip soaking up the water.

Now lay your test strip down next to the picture on the package and wait UP TO 3 MINUTES for the red lines to appear.

Positive = Yes



Negative = No



Invalid = Test Again

Remember, with test strips, **ANY LINE COUNTS AS A LINE** - no matter how dark or light it appears. The line only indicates yes or no to fentanyl being present. If you get a positive result for fentanyl, try a second test, and use even less meth than the first time. If you believe that you have a positive result, take a picture of the strip and if possible, bring a small sample of the same substance to the nearest drug checking program to where you live and ask them to test it for you.

For testing meth, using more is not better! Too much meth can cause a false positive test result.

This is the most common mistake that leads people to believe that there is fentanyl in their meth.
